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Lion King Jr. By Delaney Turner 6th Grade





Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers otherwise known as PARCC. Many of you amazing readers may want to know what the PARCC tests are for so here is why we need to take the test. PARCC is a group of states working together to develop a modern assessment that replaces previous state standardized tests. So in English here is what it really means. It means that all the states come together and devise a new learning strategy for all students.

Some people as you may know are always complaining about things, like PARCC. Most of the people complaining are kids and they are trying to do more things to get rid of the new testing ways. The old tests we used to take for the same general idea were the ISATS. The ISATS were on paper and they had a time limit and you had to answer as many

You don't know if someone had trouble on it. If you would say it was easy to them they might get upset. When you are younger, people can't really tell you if you failed because of the way the test is designed. As you get older though they started to use those test "scores" to see if you should graduate from high school.



They do this by seeing how your college readiness is. Doing PARCC is getting kids ready for high school and college, so PARCC is helpful.

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Kool - Aid & Jello Popsicles

INGREDIENTS

- 1 unsweetened Kool-Aid powdered drink mix
- 1 (3 ounce) box Jello gelatin
- 3/4 cup granulated sugar
- 2 cups boiling water
- 2 cups cold water

DIRECTIONS

1. In a 2-quart glass measure (or a large bowl), combine the Kool-Aid, Jello powder and sugar.
2. Add hot water and stir until completely dissolved.
3. Stir in cold water.
4. Pour into popsicle molds and freeze. (Or you can use Dixie cups and place popsicle sticks into them when they are partially frozen).



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
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
